



A RESOLUTION OF THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE DELAWARE TRIBE OF INDIANS TO SET POLICY ON CONTROL OF WEAPONS ON OUR DELAWARE TRIBE OF INDIANS CAMPUSES

RESOLUTION 2024-27

WHEREAS, the Delaware Tribal Council is authorized by Article V of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Delaware Tribe of Indians to represent and act in all matters that concern the general welfare of the Tribe; and

Whereas, pursuant to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Delaware Tribe of Indians, the Tribe's governing body is the Delaware Tribal Council; and

Whereas, the Delaware Tribal Council hereby deems all campus buildings owned by the Delaware Tribe of Indians to be free of weapons (including concealed carry) with the exception of security hired by the Tribe, law enforcement officers, and the Veterans' arms kept in a locked case. All individuals' weapons must be kept in locked vehicles on our campuses. Any tribal member found in noncompliance will be asked to immediately place their weapons in a locked vehicle. After three offenses a tribal member may be banned for up to thirty (30) days from all tribal property at the discretion of the Tribal Council. Any individual who is not a member of the Delaware Tribe of Indians found in noncompliance will be asked to place their weapons in a locked vehicle. After the second offense by a non-tribal member, that individual shall receive a banishment of no less than a calendar year from all Delaware owned properties. ANY individual carrying a weapon and not complying with the request to place their weapon in a locked vehicle may be escorted from the building by security or law enforcement.

Whereas, this policy will be in effect immediately and maintained for the safety of all staff, officials, tribal members, and visitors.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Delaware Tribal Council of the Delaware Tribe of Indians does hereby authorize and approve this policy.
